

SHOCKING TRUTH ABOUT CHRISTMAS Pt.7: WINTER SOLSTICE, FERTILITY RITUALS, EVERGREEN TREES, CHRISTMAS TREES

Let's start out with a bang and listen to this video about the pagan roots of all things Christmas:

*Please play this video – Pat Robertson discusses how Christmas is pagan and then it moves to actual pagans discussing how Christians hi-jacked their festival.

Of course you've got to remember ladies and gentlemen, this Christmas trees, and all the wreaths and all the garlands and all the mistletoe every bit of them come from teutonic paganism. They are not an integral part of Christianity. And so for the Seattle airport to say this is a Christian display is no such thing. (laughs) It is not a Christian display, it is winter solstice. So if they put up a sign that said we celebrate winter solstice like the teutonic gods of Thor and Wodin they would probably be more accurate. Then Pat Robertson talks about Saturnalia with orgies and nakedness and all sorts of debauchery. He says everything in Christmas was pagan. The scene changes to a table with pagans sitting around it with a pentagram on the wall. These are witches celebrating Yule. One lady says there are a lot of folks who think that the original holiday is Christmas this time of year. We kind of gently, I know Frank and I kind of gently nudge our Christian friends and say "just remember, you got all this stuff from us because we started this." Then they all laugh. The tradition of Santa actually comes from the tradition of the Oak King and the Holly King. Santa is actually the holly king who dies this time of year and gives way to the oak king to bring back the springtime. The oak king reigns during the spring and summer and the holly king reigns during the fall and winter. And so Santa's ride is sort of his passing the hat off to the oak king for the spring and summer. So there are a lot of our traditions (pagans) that are incorporated, this is a very pagan holiday, laughs, because it is. Also the Christmas tree, our Christmas tree, or our Yule tree as we (pagans) refer to it, is a very pagan holiday. And what you are doing is bringing in the greenery into your house so that what you are doing is bringing in life and vitality and all that the evergreens represent. Another lady speaks and says when she grew up she grew up with her

parents who are not pagan, but we did the whole Christmas tree which flowed very nicely into what I do now (practice paganism). Then they do a pagan ritual and say the following: To all the old gods and the gods of the woods – as we have come through the season of hibernation and darkness we look forward to the light and the rebirth as spring comes forward. Then he holds a cup with liquid and she says “lord and lady we ask that you bless this drink. Red as the blood that runs through our veins. May it bring us life, light and vitality. May it bring us passion and love...the video ends here.”*(about 3.5 min’s)

People tend to focus on the pagan things involved in celebration of Christmas but gloss right over the fact that there was debauchery of every kind involved. Orgies and all sorts of sexual immorality were going on. Fertility rituals and rites were involved as well as people who just wanted to have an excuse to do these things. It was all acceptable during this time.

I can just hear people today telling me they are not doing these things so what’s the big deal. The big deal is that all of this is tied to the Christmas festival no matter what part you keep or don’t keep. Things evolve and change over time as more things are added in. The initial meaning has been lost on us today but it isn’t lost on Jesus, He’s all knowing.

The old gods they mention and gods of the woods are the fallen angels and false gods. Paganism is idolatry against God. We are warned all through Scripture to keep ourselves from idols. **(Exodus 20:3, 1 John 5:21)**

These neo-pagans did a cleaned up version of ancient rituals where blood sacrifices occurred. They only compare the red wine to the blood in their veins, but blood was spilled in worship of their gods at winter solstice. Most of us never knew about any of the wickedness, lawlessness, sacrifices, sexual perversion, fertility rituals, offerings, riotous drinking and feasting, sun gods being worshiped etc. But now is the time to awaken and come out of this abomination that was done in idolatry against God.

She said you are bringing in life and vitality into your homes, that’s what the greenery and evergreens represent.

Let’s take a look at the greenery:

GREENERY and EVERGREEN TREES / CHRISTMAS TREES

The pagans used evergreen trees in their worship. All pagan practices are condemned by God, He warned the Israelites time and again not to do what the nations did in service of their gods. The Israelites continually adopted pagan practices and forsook God.

Deut.3:7 - And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD, and forgot the LORD their God, and served Baalim and the groves.

Baalim is plural here, meaning they served all the baal gods in every form. Nimrod is baal, they worshiped at his altars, sacred stones, images, pillars and trees. There is a poor translation that is lost on us today where it says they served the groves. Other translations say asherah poles, the asherahs, and ashtaroth. Some put it this way, they serve the baals and the asherahs or the baal gods and the asherah goddesses.

Deut.12:2-3 - Ye shall utterly destroy all the places, wherein the nations which ye shall possess served their gods, upon the high mountains, and upon the hills, and under every green tree: And ye shall overthrow their altars, and break their pillars, and burn their groves with fire; and ye shall hew down the graven images of their gods, and destroy the names of them out of that place.

and under every green tree.

Trees, particularly evergreen ones, were often associated with fertility cults and idol worship. The command to destroy these sites reflects the need to eliminate all forms of idolatry, regardless of their location or cultural significance. This also prefigures the New Testament teaching that true worship is not tied to specific locations but is in spirit and truth (John 4:23-24).

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The green trees symbolize fertility. The pagans did symbolic sex hoping the gods would emulate what they did and bless them and their land and animals with fertility. They sacrificed their children to the gods they served such as baal and molech hoping to be blessed by their gods with fertility.

1 Kings 14:22-24 And Judah did evil in the sight of the LORD, and they provoked Him to jealousy with their sins which they had committed, above all that their fathers had done. For they also built them high places, and images, and groves, on every high hill, and under every green tree. And there were also sodomites in the land: *and* they did according to all the abominations of the nations which the LORD cast out before the children of Israel.

Pagans believed they could be closer to their gods by getting up on high places, like mountains and high hills and their towers and temples. Like the tower that Nimrod built in Babel. So the Israelites began to do worship in all the high places and this angered God against them.

The NLT says they had Asherah poles on every high hill and under every green tree. The green trees were often called Asherah trees.

The presence of Asherah poles among the Israelites indicates a blending of Canaanite fertility cults with the worship of God. This syncretism was condemned in the Law, as seen in Deuteronomy 7:5 and Judges 3:7, where the Israelites are instructed to destroy such objects. The poles were a direct affront to the exclusive worship of The Lord and contributed to the spiritual decline of the nation.

The mention of "every green tree" highlights the use of natural settings for idolatrous worship. Green trees, often associated with fertility and life, were used as sites for pagan rituals and ceremonies. This practice is condemned in passages like Deuteronomy 12:2 and Isaiah 57:5, where the Israelites are warned against adopting the customs of the nations they were to dispossess. The use of green trees for worship signifies a departure from the prescribed worship of God and a return to nature-based paganism.

Pagans have always had greenery in their feast days and that is where all the greenery in Christmas comes from. It traces back to pagan worship to when Semiramis said a full grown evergreen tree sprang from a dead stump and that - this symbolized Nimrod being reborn as the sun god. Fertility rituals are always part of pagan worship.



This is a typical Christian home today with all the pagan greenery and the evergreen tree with presents under it. The womb is represented by the wreath and the tree is the phallus of Nimrod who is baal, bel and moloch. And because Semiramis, also known as Asherah and the queen of heaven, told their worshipers to bring the trees inside as part of their worship, it is not only the symbol of a phallus and Nimrod but it is also called an Asherah tree. The perfect circle of the wreath also represents the sun. Here, they are also calling the tree the image of jealousy. Pagan worship was always about fertility. That is what these things represent in the modern version of winter solstice now called Christmas.

Let's take a look at the image of jealousy in Scripture. This passage is about a time when God was showing Ezekiel, through visions, the abominable and idolatrous practices of Israel.


Ezekiel 8:3-6 - And He put forth the form of an hand, and took me by a lock of mine head; and the Spirit lifted me up between the earth and the heaven, and brought me in the visions of God to Jerusalem, to the door of the inner gate that looketh toward the north; where *was* the seat of the image of jealousy, which provoketh to jealousy. And, behold, the glory of the God of Israel *was* there, according to the vision that I saw in the plain. Then said He unto me, son of man, lift up thine eyes now the way toward the north. So I lifted up mine eyes the way toward the north, and behold northward at the gate of the altar this image of jealousy in the entry. He said furthermore unto me, son of man, seest thou what they do? *even* the great abominations that the house of Israel committeth here, that I should go far off from My sanctuary? but turn thee yet again, *and* thou shalt see greater abominations.

The general consensus is that the image of jealousy was an idol of Asherah, either a pole or image of her and it could have been a tree.

Deut.16:21 - Thou shalt not plant thee a grove of any trees near unto the altar of the LORD thy God, which thou shalt make thee.

This is referring to an Asherah tree sometimes just called an Asherah. This was at least as far back as 1400 years before Christ came to the earth as the baby in the manger. God said not to have any trees near His altar. That is because the pagans were using green trees in their worship of the fallen angels and false gods and God forbid His children to have any part of using green trees in worship to Him.

It is called the image of jealousy because it makes God jealous over His children when they worship false gods. It is like the jealousy of a husband for his wife.

The instruction "do not have any green tree near my altar" comes from the Bible, specifically [Deuteronomy 16:21](#), warning against planting trees (asherah poles) for pagan fertility worship next to God's altar, a practice associated with idolatry and lewd acts, so keeping real green trees (or symbols of them) near your personal altar often signifies avoiding such mixed worship or idolatrous associations in your spiritual practice. 

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Notice here they show that asherah poles can be the same as tree in Scripture. So when we read Asherah poles it could be a green tree, it could be a wooden carved pole of her image. To me when the passage specifically says tree I'm inclined to believe it is actually speaking of an asherah tree.

God wants our worship of Him to be pure and holy and He has told us in His Word things that don't please Him and that we should not be using in worship of Him.



The wreath represents Isis' womb as the mother goddess and the tree is Osiris' phallus or baal's phallus. Pagans and those in satan's system of worship understand what this is, it is another way they demonstrate male and female fertility worship, with the wreaths and trees. The trees are for the sun god baal / satan / osiris – just another form of obelisk and the wreath represents the womb of the mother goddess or mother nature, asherah / isis and all the other mother goddesses of which she is the main one.

The evergreen trees they used in worship back then are now called Christmas trees.



Both of these are the same, symbols of Nimrod / osiris' phallus, symbols and objects used in pagan fertility worship. These things salute the god of this world who has his imagery and symbols all over this world.



Our excellent video from part 1 told us that even King Tut would recognize and understand what the Christmas tree meant. He ruled at least 1300 years before Jesus came to the earth. Let that sink in. A pagan, heathen king would know exactly what people are doing by bringing evergreen trees into their homes. Everything the Egyptians did in worship of false gods and the fallen angels was an abomination to God. God fought against the Egyptian gods to shame the Egyptians and show them that He was the true God.

Ancient Egyptians celebrated the rebirth of the sun god Ra or Osiris on December 25th and the birth of Horus / Tammuz (son of Isis). These celebrations included decorating homes with palm branches and giving gifts.

Yes, ancient Egyptians revered green trees, which were **sacred symbols of life, death, and rebirth**. They believed trees acted as a connection between the earthly and divine realms, with specific trees associated with particular gods and goddesses. The sycamore tree was especially venerated, sometimes personified as a goddess and seen as the "Tree of Life".



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The Egyptian sun god Horace, had an evergreen acacia tree associated with him as one of his symbols.

As usual, it was stolen, just like 95% of Christian rituals and holidays are of Egyptian origin and from the Ammonite religion!

"Osiris Tree Festival"

In the middle of the month of Kiahk in the winter of every year on December 25, the ancient Egyptians celebrated the festival of the resurrection of Osiris and his return to life in the form of a tree in front of his temple in Abydos during the pilgrimage season, carrying the greenest trees to erect and plant them in the middle of the celebration square that was crowded with men, women, children, the poor and the weak, waiting for gifts and donations. They used to write their wishes on papyrus and throw them under the "Osiris" tree for the priests to fulfill them as much as possible.

A large tree called "Benu Ra / Benu Ra" is surrounded by lit candles and scented candles. Celebrations are held at the Osiris Tree on the 15th of Kiahk / December 25. Where the pilgrimage to Abydos and the establishment of Osiris shows and plays that reenact the victory of Horus over Set through two teams representing the followers of these deities during fourteen days.

Beginning with the Night of the Tree, it was believed that the coffin of Osiris was shaded by a sycamore tree in the latter half of the month of Kiahk according to the opinion of "Saleem Hassan" in the "Encyclopedia of Ancient Egypt".

As the lists of holidays in the temple of King Ramses III in the Temple of Habu indicate that celebrations of the "Osiris Tree" were held in the middle of the fourth month of the flood season "Akhet".

In "The Dawn of Conscience" the great Egyptologist "James Henry Breasted" says, commenting on the return of Isis with the tree that contained the body of Osiris:

"This god returned to life again, incarnating the body of a green tree, and so the symbol of the return of life that springs back after death became a green tree
And from that incident arose a festival that is held every year in memory of that occasion.

By raising an uprooted tree and planting it in the ground in a great gathering.
And it was beautified and decorated, and that tree is the one that it has come down to us in the form of the holiday that we still celebrate to this day.

William Nazir says in his book "Egyptian Customs Between Yesterday and Today":
"The Egyptians believed that Osiris was the force that provided them with life and sustenance in this world, and that he was the land from which green life emerged, so they drew him with ears of grain emerging from his body, and they symbolized renewed life with a green tree. Every year, they held a big party in which they erected a tree that they planted, decorated with ornaments, and covered it, as people do today with a Christmas tree!" This custom came out of Egypt and from there to Babylon, then crossed the Mediterranean to appear in the Roman holidays, then returned to appear again in the birthdays of Jesus Christ under the name of the "green Christmas tree." The word Christmas consists of two syllables: the first syllable is Christ, which means (the Savior), a title for Christ, and the second syllable is mas, which is derived from a Pharaonic word meaning (birth), such as (Ramesses), which means (son), and its origin is "(Ra) or (Ra) – Masis", and this name came about due to the religious influence of the Egyptian Orthodox Church in the early centuries, according to the website "Anba Takla".

The Catholic Church refused to put up a Christmas tree for a long time, and considered it a pagan custom. In 1982, the first Christmas tree was put up in St. Peter's Square, located in front of St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican in Rome.



St. Peter's Square, notice the Christmas tree, is placed next to the Egyptian Obelisk that was moved there from Egypt. These represent Osiris' phallus and fertility worship and idolatry against God.

The idea of having a Christmas tree in the house or exchanging gifts was not welcomed in America, especially since it is a European culture that was foreign to them, so it took a long time for this tree to become an integral part of the holiday rituals in America. This tradition began during the reign of President Franklin Pierce, who ordered the first Christmas tree to be placed in the White House, followed by President Calvin Coolidge, who ordered the lighting of the Christmas tree and the celebration in the White House garden in 1923 AD.



Here is the 1923 national Christmas tree, once again we see it placed right in the vicinity of an obelisks. They represent the same thing – fertility and idolatry against God.

L: They are raising their hands to the tree R: This Egyptian is using greenery – looks like green leaves or branches in worship and there are food and drink offerings.



The Egyptian tree goddess giving food and water to the deceased. Isis, Osiris and Horus are all linked to the acacia tree, Persea and Sycamore. Giving nourishment from these trees represented life, rebirth and the cycle of death and resurrection. For these false gods they and their trees were worshiped with various rituals and offerings because it was believed they had regenerative powers in the afterlife.





This stele shows the goddess in the tree giving out nourishment to the worshipers.



Ancient Egyptians believed acacia trees housed the spirit of Osiris and it was also the tree of Horus. They worshiped these trees and did fertility rituals under them.





The goddess with the tree crown is supposed to be giving nourishment to the souls of the individuals in bird form here which represent the people on the left I think.



I happened to run across this on Instagram. This looks like a gay couple. They said: Happy asherah season, all. In our home we celebrate the incoming winter with two lit trees – one from my partner’s childhood and one from my own. But for us, the message of both of them is one: a tree is a portal to the feminine face of the divine beloved to the ancient Ivrim/Jews, to us, and to so many: asherah. A tree in winter might look barren and even dead, but it’s only in hibernation. Winter has its gifts. We can gather around the lit branches and lean into the coziness, the cheer, the slowness, the connection, and the gifts of darkness. And

we can remember that when winter is done, springtime always comes. Trees will bloom again. asherah, nurture us please in this season of winter.

Now here's a pagan – new age couple that understands the real meaning of “Christ-mass” trees. They never were Christ mass trees – they were asherah trees and baal trees all along and that is – Nimrod / Osiris and Semiramis / Queen of Heaven / Asherah and Isis.

CLOSING

All through the Old Testament God condemns pagan practices and warns His children not to do what the pagans did. He wanted them to have nothing to do with pagan practices. We serve the same God, He does not change and we should heed His warning and also have nothing to do with anything the pagans did. The modern Christmas tree is the green tree that God condemns all through Scripture. Just because you do not do fertility rituals doesn't change the true meaning of bringing the greenery into your home. It was never about Jesus and it still isn't today.

The green trees were so engrained in pagan worship and in today's winter solstice Christmas festival that I'm going to be covering it for a few more weeks.
